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PREFACE

The present book contains a critical edition of one of the most important catalogues of endowments in Iran, compiled and published as a lithograph print more than hundred years ago. This catalogue was a major effort to register, and thus lay claim to, the numerous properties belonging to the shrine of Imām Rižā in Mashhad. Known also as the Holy Threshold, $\bar{A}st\bar{a}n$ -i Quds-i Ražavī, the burial place of the eighth Shi'i Imam remains the most prominent site of pilgrimage in Iran. Looking back, this book represents in many ways a turning point in the history of the shrine and its administration. It signals the rise of the $\bar{A}st\bar{a}n$ -i Quds to become one of the most important independent organizations of modern Iran, culturally, economically, as well as politically.

We began working on *Āthār al-Rażavīva* a long way back in 2001. At that time we were both placed at the West Asian History Department of Kyoto University, MORIKAWA Tomoko as a graduate student and Christoph WERNER as a post-doc research fellow supported by the Kyoto University Foundation. At the beginning, this was a limited research and reading project, but the idea of preparing a critical edition of this fascinating source became more concrete during a research stay by MORIKAWA Tomoko at the University of Bamberg in 2002, funded by the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). The text and its contents proved to be more difficult than expected and the preparation of a definite text extremely time consuming. Entering the documents of *Āthār al-Rażavīva* into a modest database proved useful, and independently we worked on various aspects of the history of the $\bar{A}st\bar{a}n-i$ Ouds in Mashhad.¹ Without the constant help, support and gentle pressure exercised by Professor MIURA Toru, Director of the West Asian Studies Group of the Toyo Bunko, himself a leading specialist of vaqf studies, this edition would never have seen the light. We are very grateful for his offer to publish *Āthār al-Rażavīva* in the series of the Toyo Bunko Research Library. For continuous advice and encouragement we express our heartfelt thanks to Emad al-Din Shevkh al-Hokamaee in Tehran. We equally owe debts to younger colleagues in the field who invested valuable time and energy in this project, notably Dr. SUGIYAMA Masaki and Dr. ABE Naofumi.

In the end, the present edition is a compromise, even after all these years. We do not claim to have resolved all remaining editorial problems and challenges, and we are well aware that this edition is only the first step towards a more profound analysis and historical interpretation of $\bar{A}th\bar{a}r$ al-Rażavīya. Nevertheless, it is a beginning and hopefully will prove useful for anybody working on the history of
