

of the Khokand khan in and after the rebellion of Jihangir Khoja and Yusuf Khoja in the first half of the 19th century. The eastern policy of the Khokand Khanate consisted, from the author's point of view, in monopolizing the international trade around the Pamir and Kashgar borderlands during 1760~1860, so that the country shaped herself into a big power in Central Asia before the Russian invasion.
