The Role of Sangjayidorji 桑斎多爾済 under the Ch'ing 清 Streng thening the Rule over the Qalq-a Mongolia during the Middle Years of Ch'ien-lung 乾隆

Sangjayidorji, one of the nobles of Tüsiyetü qan ayimay, played a very important role in the Ch'ing dynasty's policy of consolidating its rule over Qalq-a Mongolia in the years of Ch'ien-lung 乾隆, especially after the invasion of Jegün yar by Ch'ing forces. He supported the Ch'ing in the Qalq-a Mongol resistance, as well as in the rebellion of Činggünjab and in the Qalq-a movement for the Russian rule. Accordingly, Sangjayidorji was appointed to conduct negotiations with Russia, and oversee Yeke Küriy-e 庫倫 of Jebtsündamba qutuytu. This is the origin of Küriyen-ü amban 庫倫辦事大臣. Because of Sangjayidorji's support, Ch'ing rulers were able to realiza and consolidate easily their dominance over the Qalq-a, especially over Tüsiyetü qan ayimay.

Some scholars claim that Sangjayidorji resisted the Ch'ing, but the author thinks not. Rather Sangjayidorji served the Ch'ing ruler's intention to rob the power which Tisiyetii qan and Čenggiinjab (lieutenant general of Uliyasutai) held over the Qalq-a Mongols.
